Passengers Demand Wireless News Printed En Route.

'BEAR'S GROWL' MAKES HIT

Dispatches Concerning Mexican Revolution Eagerly Sought by Voyagers Along Coast When Operator Gets Out Papers.

Newspapers published at sea on coastwise passenger vessels entering this port have become so popular that it is impossible to meet the demand.

News of the trouble with Mexico seems to be a drawing card with the passengers of the vessels, an one or more dispatches from that source are published in the papers.

In addition to news received by wireless telegraph, the newspapers on the steamers contain lists of passengers on board, but restrictions on the steamship companies prevent the publication in these papers of anything of a personal nature concerning the passengers.

STUDENTS COMPLAIN TEACHING FALLS SHORT.

Grand Jury to Inquire Into Telegraph Institute on Accusation of Two Youths.

Attention of the grand jury will be invited by Deputy District Attorney Collier to the operations of the local branch of the National Telegraph Institute, with offices in the Acherson building, Fifth and Alder streets, concerning which two youths have complained of misrepresentation.

The complainants are Gordon Hoy, 17 years old, and Penton M. Porter, of the same age. Hoy paid \$25 for a scholarship and Porter paid \$75, induced by a catalogue in which the merits of the institute and the opportunities for telegraph operators were set forth in glowing terms.

It is said that the institute has a good reputation in other places. Its Portland manager is H. D. Burris. The catalogue informs the prospective student that he can obtain board for \$3 a week, and that upon completion of his course, he will be recommended for a position upon "graduating" he will be furnished with free transportation by the road employing him.
