LICENSE SALE ORDERED

Council Compels Saloonman to Transfer Grant or Forfeit It.

Councilman Lombard appeared yesterday as complainant against Paul Sprawkin, proprietor of a saloon at Fourteenth and Pettigrove streets, when his case came before the liquor-licensing committee of the City Council on charges of selling liquor Sundays, assaulting a policeman and attempting to bribe Policemen Taff and Short, who arrested him. The committee heard the testimony of all concerned, and ordered the accused saloonman to transfer his license within two weeks to another person or forfeit it.

W. C. McDonald appeared to inquire of the members of the committee whether they would permit him to have in his two establishments, seats five inches higher than allowed by the ordinance. He conducts a place at 163 Sixth street and another at 427 Washington street. He was instructed to comply with the law. His appearance was occasioned by the activity of License Inspector Hutchinson, who has been scrutinizing restaurants where liquors are sold.

CONFERENCE IS ARRANGED

Workers in Men's Missionary Movement to Meet in Y. M. C. A.

Arrangements for the conference of the Men's Missionary Movement, to be held in the auditorium of the Portland Young Men's Christian Association next Thursday and Friday, were completed at a meeting of the local committee of management at the Y. M. C. A. yesterday. The meeting was attended by representatives of the Y. M. C. A. and

practically all local protestant denominations.

The most prominent speakers connected with the Men's Missionary Movement will attend the conference. J. Campbell White, chairman of the movement, will give the principal address, and Colonel E. W. Halford, vice-chairman of the movement, and E. Earl Taylor, secretary of the Methodist Missionary Movement, all of New York City, will participate. G. F. Johnson, chairman of the local committee, will preside.

A leading part in making arrangements for the conference is being taken by the Y. M. C. A. R. R. Perkins, religious work director of the association, is now receiving registrations for the

meetings and dinners to be held in connection with the conference. Because of the size of the auditorium, the attendance has been limited to 200. Although registration was opened only yesterday afternoon, 80 applications had been received before night. It is hoped to have every protestant evangelical church in Portland represented.

CENTENNIAL ENVOYS HERE

Astoria Men Confer With Local Bodies on Celebration.

A. Tremp, manager, and Herman Wise, member of the Astoria Centennial committee, passed yesterday in Portland in conference with officials of the Portland Commercial Club and other local organizations, including the Rose Festival Association and the Retail Grocers' Association in the interest of the Astoria exposition.

"The dates for the Astoria Centennial have been fixed," said ex-Mayor Wise, "and the exposition will be held August 10 to September 8, inclusive. Preliminary details for the exposition are being arranged and the outlook for a creditable show is good. The centennial will be a good thing for the entire state. At the same time it will serve appropriately to commemorate an event closely associated with the early settlement of the state."

Oregon through its recent Legislature appropriated \$50,000 for the Astoria Centennial while a similar amount will be provided by the people of Astoria and Clatsop County to make the event the success that is planned.
