## SWIMMING POOL VOTED

### MAYOR SIMON'S PLAN ADOPTED BY PARK BOARD.

Improvement of Playground at Marquam Gulch to Be Pushed With All Diligence.

Mayor Simon's recommendation that a swimming tank and children's playground be installed without delay in Marquam Gulch, South Portland, was unanimously adopted by the Park Board yesterday morning. Dr. J. H. Vatharbee, a member of the Board, moved that the apparatus be ordered at once and that the work be prosecuted with all diligence. This motion was carried and an effort will be made to complete the tank in time for use this Summer.

"I desire very much to have this work at least well under way before I get out of office," said Mayor Simon to the members of the Board. "It is the one thing I desire to see accomplished above all others in the park line. Establishing of a swimming tank there will save many lives, without doubt, and will be of great general benefit." The contract for furnishing the tank this Summer was awarded to Charles L. Brown for \$3000. He will provide a band of 12 pieces and it is

probable the concerts will start in July night. Rev. Mr. Booser is expected to accept the call.

## CLEVER THIEF ESCAPES

### MERCHANTS INDIGNANT OVER SIZE OF SURETY.

Friends Outside of City Give Bond of \$500 for Him and He Departs at Once.

Nearly a dozen retail merchants are disgruntled over the forfeiture of a \$500 bond and the escape from trial of George Buckley, arrested last week by Detectives Carpenter and Price as a professional shoplifter. At least one of their number talked to the District Attorney and Municipal Judge Taxwell yesterday expressing his warm indignation that the prisoner had been held under so small a surety.

Ten charges lay against Buckley, covering alleged thefts from nearly as many establishments. When arrested, he communicated with friends outside the city and they caused his bail to be put up by a surety company, depositing collateral to protect the company. When the case was called yesterday morning Buckley failed to appear, and it is believed that he has left the city. A bench warrant has been issued, but with little prospect that he will be brought back. Buckley escaped very luckily with the loss of his bail of \$500, says his victim. He is a clever operator, coming himself to stealing valuable articles. His

method is to rush hurriedly into a large store, carrying a tourist bag, and affecting the manner of a tourist stopping over for a few hours. He professes a request for some small but troublesome article, and seizes the opportunity thus provided to slip into his bag some article of high price. When he was arrested his valise was packed full of fine cameras, scientific instruments and similar articles. Firms handling this sort of goods were his victims in most cases.

DALLAS, Or., April 7.—(Special.)—Business men here yesterday visited the County Court, which was in session, and asked for an appropriation of \$3750 for the construction of an armory. The City Council last night passed a resolution appropriating a like amount. Walter L.
