Bark Mimi Completes Fastest Passage From Coast This Season.

Meyer, Wilson & Co. yesterday added the French ship Thiers to the list of vessels bound for Portland from Europe and she will be placed on the berth at Selfast to load general cargo. The vessels has not been taken for new crop loading, but negotiations will no doubt be entered into soon for that purpese. The Thiers was a member of the present season's grain fleet, hav-ing cleared for the United Kingdom December 7.

' The Gorman bark Miami has been wive credit by the Coast marine fra-ternity of having completed the smart-est passage of the season, when she arrived at Falmouth May 19 from Purt-land, making the run in 108 days. That time exceeds the best passages from any Pacific Coast port since July 1. The record in 1910 was 117 days, made by the French bark La Rochejacqueline, though the German barg Frieds sailed from the Columbia River to Dungeness in 168 days. The Mimi was ordered to St. Nazaire to discharge, while the British steamer Strathness, carrying one of the five largest grain cargoes dispatched this season, was ordered from St. Vincent to Naples to union.
