

COMMISSION PLAN IS LEADING ISSUE

Certainty of Mayor Simon's Position Continues to Win Votes for Him.

SPEEDY ACTION PROMISED

Opponent's Pledges Belated and Half-Hearted - Rushlight Following Unwilling to Let Go Reins of Office.

There is no disputing the fact that the adoption of a commission form of government for this city is the real issue in this campaign. Despite the efforts of his detractors Mayor Simon's position on this important issue always has been consistent and at this time is winning for him many supporters.

Fully eight months ago, before the question of a commission form of government developed as an issue in this campaign, Mayor Simon in an interview plainly and without equivocation declared for a commission charter for this city.

Related Indorsements Indecisive. Neither of his opponents committed themselves to the commission plan until months after Simon had approved it.

Without reservation or apology, he recognized the fact that the commission government for Portland and just as frankly placed himself on record as favoring such a charter. But with his opponents it was different. They recognized the commission plan of government as an issue only after Mayor Simon had forced it as an issue.

Consequently, it is not to be expected that they will do anything toward bringing about such a substitution of charters. The adoption of a commission plan would put several of them out of office.

But Mayor Simon's position on this subject is clear. His experience of two years in the Mayor's chair has thoroughly convinced him that the growing needs of the city demand a commission government of the city's affairs are to be wisely and economically conducted, free from graft and all suspicion of graft.
