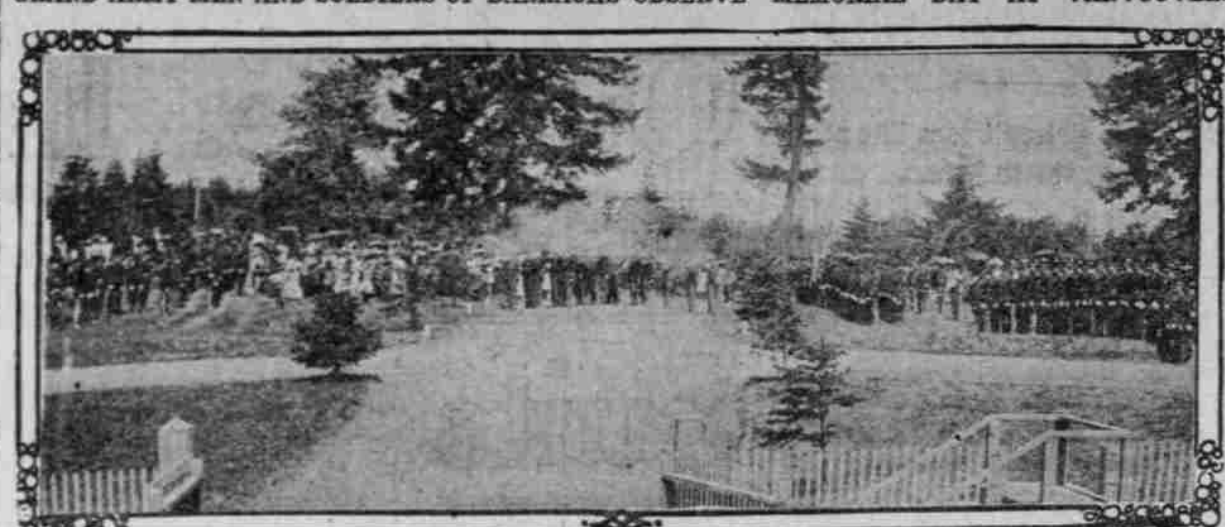
Michael Dampffofer Will Be 100 Years Old in Three Years.

INCIDENT IS DRAMATIC

Octogenarian and His Son Walk Side by Side in Broiling Sun at Vancouver, Wash., to Observe Fiftieth Anniversary.

VANCOUVER, Wash., May 26.—(Special.)—Michael Dampffofer, Sr., 97 years old, and his son, Michael Dampffofer, Jr., 47 years old, both veterans of the Civil War, marched in the Memorial parade here today. It is believed that the aged veteran, who will be a century old in three years, was the oldest one to march through the streets of a city in the scorching heat of the Pacific Coast, if not in the whole United States.
