Notes of the Game. Umpire Finney was on the job with both feet yesterday, and while some of his decisions might be questioned, he was fair in all of them.


Jack Barry was very much in yesterday's game. Three times Harry started things either getting a base or planting a seed, and each time the veteran landed across the register.




