

CORONATION HAS MUCH CEREMONY

Pomp and Tradition Figure Prominently in Crowning of King.

REGALIA IS ELABORATE

Rich Robes Are Worn by Monarch in Different Parts of Impressive Service—Swords, Scepters and Rings Are Used.

LONDON, June 21.—The details of the coronation ceremony at Westminster Abbey have been set forth at length in the official order of service. Upon entering the church the king and queen are received by the singing of an anthem. Then, upon taking their places, the official recognition takes place. The litany is then sung by two bishops, after which follows the beginning of the communion service and the sermon. The king is then administered by the archbishop, after which the ceremony of the anointing takes place. Then His Majesty receives the sword and is girded with the sword, is invested with the armill and the royal robe, and handed the orb. At this point follows the actual crowning by the archbishop, after which comes the presentation of the holy Bible, the benediction, the inthronization, and the homage. It follows then the coronation of Her Majesty, the Queen, the conclusion of the communion service, the prayer of consecration and the Te Deum Laudamus.

King Arrives in Robes.

The king drives to the Abbey on coronation, wearing a crimson satin under-robe reaching to the knees, over which he wears his crimson parliamentary robes, which, however, he takes off on reaching the Abbey. After the ceremony of the anointing, he puts on in succession the columbin sinclon, or a sort of alb, such as is worn by bishops; then comes the tunicle or damatic, followed by the stole and finally the imperial mantle, or pall. The tunicle is a long coat of cloth of gold with wide sleeves. Just below the throat it meets in front and thence falls straight to the feet, thus completely enveloping the king's body. The imperial mantle, or pall, is similar to a cope. The emblems, comprising the imperial crown, the imperial eagle, the rose, shamrock and thistle, with the lotus flower of India are encircled by wreaths of laurel leaves.

The royal robe of state which the king wears while proceeding from the vestibule of the Abbey to the "chapel" where he takes his throne during the ceremony, is of rich crimson velvet, embellished with heavy gold lace. It has a train of great length and is lined throughout with royal ermine, hundreds of alms being necessary for this purpose. This is spotted with more than 10,000 small pieces of black fur.

Crown Will Be Worn.

After the ceremony His Majesty will leave the Abbey attired in a robe of royal purple, under which he will wear an under coat of purple. On his head he will wear the imperial crown. The ancient regalia were destroyed by the republicans in 1649 by order of Parliament, but were replaced by articles of a similar kind made for the coronation of Charles II in 1662. These, together with the crown jewels, are kept in the Tower of London.

St. Edward's crown is the official crown of England, which the monarch is usually crowned with, although Edward VII made an exception, as on that occasion it was merely carried in the procession. It is a gold crown, encircled with the cross of St. George and surrounded by a circle of 26 diamonds. It is pointed like a bracelet so that it may fit fingers of different sizes.

The ring of alliance, sometimes called in ancient writings "the wedding ring of England," is of pure gold, set with a large brilliant ruby, violet in color, chased with the cross of St. George and surrounded by a circle of 26 diamonds. King Edward's chair, on which all monarchs of England sit when they are crowned, has a very long history. It is generally known as St. Edward's chair, as a mark of respect to Edward the Confessor, near whose shrine in Westminster Abbey it usually stands. It was made by order of Edward I, to hold the coronation stone, or stone of destiny, on which the Scottish monarchs used to sit when they were crowned. Edward I seized this stone when he had practically subdued Scotland and sent it to Westminster in 1284. At each coronation ceremony, with the single exception of that of Mary I, who was crowned in the chair sent to her by the Pope, it is brought out of St. Edward's chapel and placed before the altar, in the eastern part of the Abbey.

When Oliver Cromwell was installed in the office of Protector it was taken into Westminster Hall, which forms a portion of the Parliament building. It was returned to the Abbey and this was the only occasion on which it has ever been taken out of the Abbey.

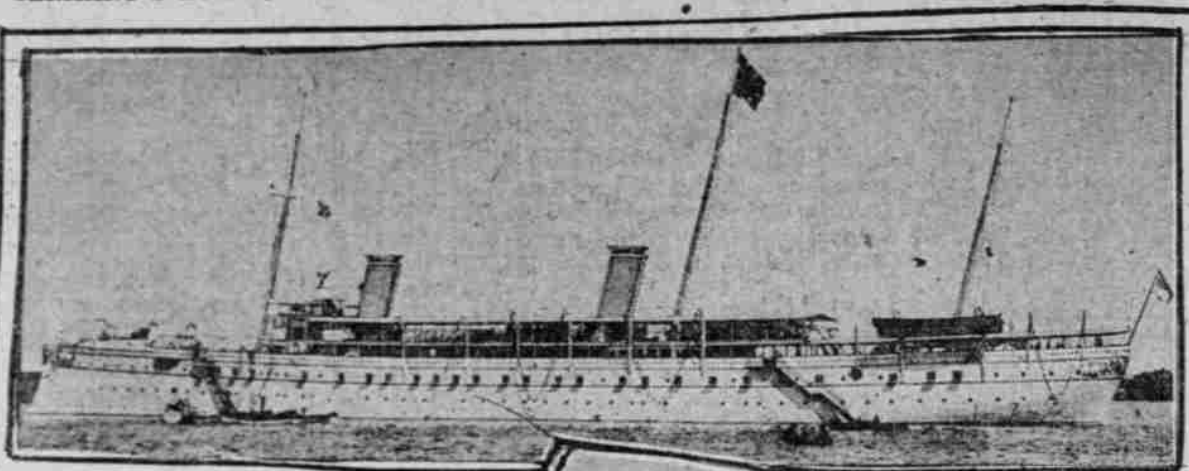

Enthusiasm Is High.

Ambassador Hammond will be escorted to the palace at 7:30 o'clock this morning by Lord Sandhurst, who will drive with him in the procession. KAISER SEES FLEET

American Warships Inspected by German Emperor.

FESTIVAL IS ON AT KIEL

United States Collier Cyclops Attracts More Attention Than Battleships Themselves—Guns Boom Loud Salutes.

KIEL, Germany, June 21.—The American warships of the second division of the Atlantic fleet arrived here today and are now anchored in the inner harbor before the town, surrounded by the array of battleships and yachts gathered for the Emperor's great annual naval festival.

Almost the entire German Navy, including a full division of the new dreadnaughts, are assembled, the only absentees being the cruiser Von der Tann, which is at Spithead for the coronation, and the reserve division at Wilhelmshaven.

Admiral Von Tirpitz, Admiral of the fleet, minister and creator of the new German Navy, heads an imposing list of admiral commanders.

Salutes Keep Guns Hot. As the American battleships, led by the Louisiana, flagship of Rear-Admiral Badger, slowly steamed through the narrowing fiord and passed long lines of German ships, they turned to their assigned places between the flagships Deutschland and Kaiser Wilhelm II, and the other vessels of the German fleet.

The German ships, in light gray paint, presented a cheerful appearance under the brilliant sunshine and contrasted markedly with the dark sides of the Americans. As soon as the visitors were moored, the Louisiana, and Admiral Von Tirpitz's flag and the salute was promptly answered. From then on the guns were kept hot with an almost unintermittent series of salutes for several hours, as the admirals, commanders, diplomats and representatives came and went between the entertaining and visiting, exchanging official calls of courtesy.

Retiring Ambassador Received. Dr. David Jayne Hill, the retiring American Ambassador to Germany, arrived during the forenoon and boarded the Kansas, where he will be quartered during his stay here.

Later in the day the United States Collier Cyclops arrived and attracted more attention from the crowd on the quays than the battleships. In addition to the Louisiana and Kansas, the American battleships of the visiting division include the New Hampshire and South Carolina.

Emperor William arrived here this afternoon from Hamburg on the Hohenzollern and was saluted with 33 guns by every warship in the harbor. The American crews, like the Germans, manned the sides of the vessels with the Imperial yacht and hoisted the German ensign.

The Hohenzollern, with the Emperor on the bridge, the Imperial standard and the ensign, the mainmast and the Stars and Stripes from the mizzenmast, steamed past the German and American lines while the crews of each vessel in turn cheered. At the end of the American line the Hohenzollern came about and passed between the South Carolina and the Louisiana to permit his majesty a closer inspection of the battleships.

Soon afterward Ambassador Hill and Admiral Badger, with the other American commanders, visited the Imperial yacht where they were presented to the Emperor.

LUMBERMEN SET FREE. TAFT PARDONS THREE OF PEONAGE OFFENDERS. Florida Senator Persuades President That Prisoners Are Punished Enough.

WASHINGTON, June 21.—President Taft today ordered the immediate release of W. S. Harlan, C. C. Hilton and S. E. Higgins, of the Jackson Lumber Company, of Lockport, Ala., who are now serving sentences in Atlanta penitentiary for peonage.

The President extended clemency at the request of Senator Fletcher of Florida. President Taft, before leaving for New Haven yesterday, told the Senator he believed the men had been punished enough.

Gallagher and Grace, convicted at the same time for the same offense, are not included in the clemency. It is understood, however, that Senator Fletcher has asked President Taft to release Grace and Gallagher also.

Harlan is a successful lumberman of some wealth. President Taft first commuted his original sentence to six months and a fine of \$5000. Harlan later applied for pardon, and the President refused it. Hilton was sentenced to six months and fined \$1000 and Higgins received a like sentence and a fine. Grace, however, was sentenced to 13 months and fined \$1000 and Gallagher to 15 months and fined \$1000.

GILLNETTER IS DROWNED

Axel Johnson and Boatpuller Fall in Columbia; Latter Saved.

ASTORIA, Or., June 21.—(Special.)—Axel Johnson, a gillnetter employed by the Warren Packing Company, was drowned last evening near Sand Island and his body was recovered this morning. The wind was blowing strongly and Johnson's boat, which was occupied by himself and his boat-puller became entangled among the piling at the Warren receiving dock.

William Goldbeck and Jenner Parker went out with a launch and cleared the boat. Johnson then hoisted sail and started for the fishing grounds. As the boom swung around before the wind, both men grabbed it and both were hurled into the water. The boat-puller was rescued by the launch, which hastened to give assistance, but Johnson went down. The deceased was about 40 years old and is survived by a widow. He had been employed by the Warren Packing Company for several years.

Cannery Fleet at Nushagak River.

ASTORIA, Or., June 21.—(Special.)—Letters were received today from Nushagak River, Alaska, under date of May 28. They say all the cannery fleet from this river has arrived safely and all on board were well. The spring is very late in the North and the letters say five or six feet of snow still lay in spots. The upper river was just beginning to break up and the streams and bay were filled with floating ice.
