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WASHINGTON, June 29.—Representative Humphrey, of Washington, has reintroduced his bill looking to the promotion of the American merchant marine in foreign trade.

It provides a subsidy plan for fast modern ships to carry the mails, increases the tonnage taxes on foreign vessels, and provides for free ships for foreign trade.

The Commission will investigate and provide what it may consider equitable regulations.

BRANDY FRUIT PLENTIFUL

Distillers Quick to Act When Blackberries glut market.

CHICAGO, June 29.—Enough blackberry brandy will be distilled to discourage the most optimistic prohibitionist this season if present conditions in the produce market at Chicago continue. Commission men yesterday said that receipts of these berries so far this year have doubled those of a year ago and that although there had been a cut of fully 50 per cent in prices, daily arrivals from Illinois, Indiana and Tennessee continue exceptionally large.

Tribes From Pacific Northwest Will Assemble in Idaho.

LEWISTON, Idaho, June 29.—(Special.)—The first Indian reunion of all the tribes of the Northwest commences July 3. Nearly 2000 Indians of Idaho, Oregon, Washington and other states will gather at the pow-wow to be held on a large butte near Winchester, Idaho, set aside by the Government for Indians' use.
