LORDS INDORESE CLAUSE 2 As Amended, That Section of Veto Measure Is Passed.

LONDON, July 6.—The Lords passed clause two of the veto bill, as amended, by division, today, and the debate proceeded on the new clause moved by Lord Cromer, providing for the appointment of a joint committee of the two houses in case of a deadlock. Clause two of the veto bill has to do with the restrictions of the powers of the House of Lords in respect to bills other than money bills.

Lad Who Shot Another Arrested.
EVERETT, Wash., July 6.—(Special.)—Orders that Lee Gray, the youth who shot another boy near Darrington Tuesday, be taken into custody, were given today by Assistant Prosecutor Webb

and were carried out by a Deputy Sheriff at Arlington. Tomorrow Sheriff Desiring, Coroner Smith and Webb will go to Darrington to investigate the case thoroughly. According to an account which reached here today, Simons, Gray and several other boys were discussing hold-ups just before the tragedy and the revolver had been snatched several times, though it was apparently unloaded then, or the cartridge was faulty. It is supposed now that Gray unconsciously placed a bullet in the revolver before he took the revolver out and fired the fatal shot.

Falls City Farmer Fire Victim.
FALLS CITY, Or., July 6.—(Special.)—The barn, granary, wagon shed and blacksmith shop of J. W. Lee, near this city, were destroyed by fire at 11 last night. Farming implements, two horses and two sets of harness were burned. The loss is estimated at \$1500, with no insurance.

Vancouver to Banquet Swartz.
VANCOUVER, Wash., July 6.—(Spe-

cial.)—Ira M. Swartz, who for three years was president of the Vancouver Commercial Club, will be guest of honor at a banquet given in Hotel St. Elmo Saturday night. Mr. Swartz, who has been chief clerk in the Quartermaster's department in Vancouver barracks, has been transferred by the Civil Service to Fort Wright.

Chehalis Widow's Daughter Missing.
CHEHALIS, Wash., July 6.—(Special.)—When it was discovered today that Miss Leona Hedrick, daughter of Mrs. Lulu Hedrick, a widow, had disappeared during last night, Tom Carter, who boards at the Hedrick home, went to the Chehalis restaurant and threatened to shoot the proprietors. It is believed that the girl left in company with J. Cost, one of the owners of the restaurant. Carter was persuaded not to shoot, and in the meantime the officials are making every effort to locate Cost and the Hedrick girl.

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
