

BEAVERS FIRST
TO GAIN REVENGETeam Returns Home Today
After Most Disastrous
Series of Season.

9 GAMES IN 14 ARE LOST

Hustling Oaks, Who Captured Six
Out of Seven at Fast Meeting,
Will Be Opponents on Home
Grounds Today.

Beginning at 3 o'clock this afternoon, Walter McCredie's league leading Beavers, with their margin as vanguards somewhat diminished by the disasters suffered at Los Angeles and San Francisco, will open another three weeks' series on the home grounds with the Oakland Braves as the contending club.

The Beavers fared very badly at the hands of the rejuvenated Angels during the first week of the fortnight's stay away from home, for "Pa" Berry's rejuvenated wallpapers trimmed the leaders right royally. However, the Beavers' chief is inclined to place some of the blame for the reverses at the door of Umpire Finney. Whether the umpire was to blame, it is certain that the Portland twirlers were not working up to form, for the Angels batted mightily, and so did the Seals in the games dropped at last week.

As a rule the Beavers have been most successful away from home, but the journey which ended Sunday was their most disastrous this season. They lost 8 out of 14 games played. They made a better showing than this on the former excursion when Oakland, the club which opens here this afternoon, landed in seven games played, for that time they came back by recouping against Sacramento.

Wonderful Exhibition of One-Hand

Fielding and Run-Stopping Wit-

nessed in Game With Giants.

SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 7.—(Special.)—

Seattle ran neck and neck with Portland

today for seven and one-half innings,

and then rushed over enough runs to

cinch the battle. Score, 6 to 2.

Pearl Casey gave the most wonderful

exhibition of one-hand fielding and run-

stopping that has been seen in our fair

city for many months. The crowd went

wild over his work and had him taking

off his cap until he was in danger of

wearing off the hirsute appendage. He

robbed the locals of hits right and left,

and made them cling to the bases when

it seemed certain that they could come

flocking over.

However, the story of the sensational

fielding does not end here. Eddie House-

holder stopped Portland's rally in the

eighth by climbing the right field fence,

grabbing Casey's hit that looked like a

home run, and doubling Pettigrew at first.

Not least among the features was the
