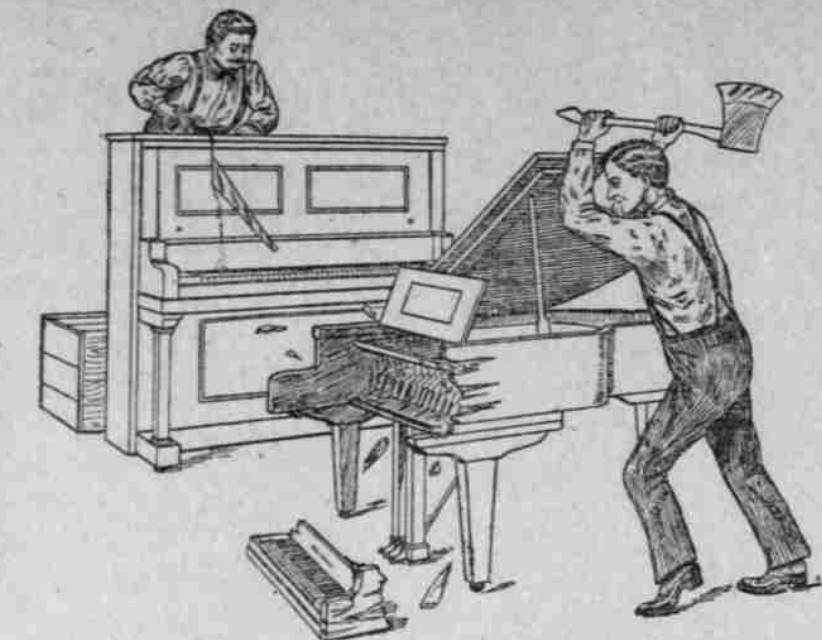


FARM WHEEL TRAVEL Pigs, Poultry and Seeds to Be Carried by Train. OREGON SPECIES TO RULE

OLCOTT ADMITS PLOT

SECRETARY SAYS FRAUDULENT NAMES NOT FILED. Answer in University Referendum Petition Case Alleges Illegal Signatures Thrown Out.

SALEM, Or., Sept. 21.—(Special.)—Admitting that in the months of March and April of this year a conspiracy was entered into between George Higgins, alias George Harris, St. Sandrosky, alias Sam Cohn, Elmer Brown and others to defraud the voters of the state, and Harry F. Parkinson, who led the referendum movement against the University of Oregon appropriations, by forging names to the petitions, but asserting that the fraud was discovered by Parkinson and the petitions never filed, Secretary of State Olcott today filed with the Clerk of the Circuit Court here his answer to the complaint filed by B. S. Josselyn asking that the Secretary of State be enjoined from placing the title of the two appropriation bills on the ballot on the ground that they are illegal because of fraud in the petitions.
