initiative and referendium features of the constitution and other popular laws. Judge Harris is a native of Oregon, having heen born at Albany Septem-ber 12, 1575. He was educated at the University of Oregon. from which in-stitution he was graduated in 1893, and subsequently was graduated from the law department of the University of Michigan. In 1896 he was admitted to the bar of this state and a year later was appointed Depuis District Attor-mey for the Second Judicial District a position which he held for a number of years. of Sears.

It was during these years that Judge Harris developed ability as a public prosecutor and his vigilance resulted in many convictions. He represented Lane County in the Lower House of the Legislature at the secolons of 1981 and 1993 and was Speaker of the House during the latter year. When the sec-sion of 1993 adjourned Judge Harris was greatly admired by the younger element of the Republican party throughout the state. An offort was made to send him to Congress from the First District the following year, but the veteran Hermann was too strongly entreached and Judge Harris was defrated in the district conven-tion at Balem. 
