

CHARLES W. CLARK MERRY HOST HERE

Son of Copper King and Seven Guests in Private Car Pay Portland Visit.

ALL PUFF CIGARETTES

Scion of Noted Father Declares He May Enter Power and Light Business in This City—Taft or Harmon His Choice.

Social select of Butte and California were guests of Charles W. Clark, son of ex-Senator William A. Clark, Montana copper king, in his private car on the Southern Pacific tracks at the Union Depot last night.

Seated in the buffet portion of the car the company chatted and passed a social hour, previous to a dinner party, which has been scheduled for 7 o'clock.

Hotel Luncheon Given. Mr. Clark and his party arrived yesterday from Montana, and left last night for San Mateo, Cal., where Mr. Clark has his residence.

Mr. Clark is a dapper young chap, and, aside from his social proclivities, is much of a business man, and a political thinker. He explained that he was interested in power plants and was here looking over the ground with a view to entering in the power and light business.

Mr. Clark has just returned from an inspection of his holdings in Montana. He has extensive railway, light and power holdings there, owning all the light and power service of the Bitter Root Valley.
