

DANGER TO PEACE OF WORLD IS SEEN

Germany Hopes Struggle May Be Localized, but Fears Opposite Result.

AUSTRIAN AMBITION FELT

Balkan Profets Declared to Have Inspired Complaisance Toward Italian Plans—Brutal Methods Are Denounced.

BERLIN, Sept. 29.—(Special.)—Can the war be localized? This is a question which everybody is asking. No one pretends to foresee the ultimate consequences of the struggle, but the fear is universal that the situation for months to come will be full of danger to the world's peace.

While the government officially is not taking sides, public sentiment is strongly inclined to sympathize with Turkey. A section of the press severely condemns Italy for the abrupt and dictatorial manner in which it precipitated the crisis.

German military experts are practically unanimous in their opinion that Italy's superiority on land and sea is sufficient to assure its ultimate victory.

The Lokai Anzeiger, which is in close touch with the Foreign Office, says the state with the slightest regard for its honor can only answer 'no' to the action of Italy.

The Frankfurter Zeitung declares civilized Europe, disregarding political differences, must protest against an act of open pillage and naked violence.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 29.—The Turkish Cabinet has resigned. Said Pasha, president of the Senate, has been appointed Grand Vizier and Kaimil Pasha, Foreign Minister.

PARIS, Sept. 29.—The Matin learns from a high official source that if the Turkish government does not oppose the occupation of Tripoli, Italy will be ready to give Turkey the fullest satisfaction, both moral and material.

Officials versed in the history of recent wars recall that Italy in striking first is only following the example of Japan in its war with Russia, when it secured a tremendous advantage from a naval point of view by preventing the consolidation of the two sections of the Russian fleet, which were lying in the harbors of Port Arthur and Chemulpo, Corea.

It is said at the State Department that there can be no objection by this Government to the course adopted by Italy in this instance so long as there is no interference with American commerce or other interests.
