SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 1 .- The initiel move in what was announced as a Nation-wide campaign for the upbuild-ing of the American merchant marine was made yesterday when San Francisco Chamber of Commerce adopted a resolution urging that vessels flying the American flag be passed through the Panama Canal without tell. 
