

PORTLAND PREPARES TO RECEIVE TAFT

President of United States to Be Guest of City for Eight Hours Today.

OPEN-ARM WELCOME READY
Most Distinguished American to Arrive at 5 o'Clock Tonight—Parade From Depot Arranged. Public to Hear Speech.

Portland is ready to receive with open arms William Howard Taft, President of the United States, who is to be the guest of the city from 5 o'clock this evening until 1:30 o'clock tomorrow morning.

The parade will be led by Captain Moore, of the police department, who will ride at the head of 12 mounted policemen. Behind them and directly in front of the President's car will be 14 regular police mounted on horses at Vancouver. Behind the President's car will be a large automobile carrying secret service agents, with a staff of 12 soldiers stretched across the street bringing up the rear.

The President will be taken to a suite of rest rooms at the club, where he will rest for 30 minutes before going to the main dining-room for the banquet which has been prepared in his honor. The banquet will probably be the most elaborate function of the kind ever held at the Commercial Club.

The banquet over, the President will proceed to the hall where he will deliver an hour's address to the general public. Thence he will go to the Knights of Columbus Hall, open the Commercial Club program and board the train for the Union Depot to board his train, which will leave later for Salem.
