CENSUS FRAUD ADMITTED

Enumerator De Bord Pleads Guilty. Trio Will Stand Trial.

Four census enumerators indicted by the Federal grand jury last July on charges of making false census reports and also for representing alleged false census returns to the government, are to stand trial this morning. Vincent Manning and Conrad Zellweger both pleaded not guilty, while John H. James was given until Monday to enter a plea. Zellweger will be tried November 3 and Manning November 14.

Special Prosecutor Newton is here and probably will handle the cases for the government. A penalty of both fine and imprisonment is provided for falsifying the census reports, the fine not to exceed \$2000, and the imprisonment not to exceed five years. For making false claims against the government either a fine or imprisonment or both, to the same extent as for making false reports are provided.
