

PENNANT ALMOST IN BEAVERS' HANDS

Successive Victories Only Chance for Hogan to Overtake McCredie.

PORTLAND SPLITS EVEN

Honors Divided in Columbus Day Double Header in Los Angeles.

Villagers Are Twice Beaten by Oakland.

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 12.—(Special.)—Two holiday games were played at Chutes Park this afternoon by Portland and Los Angeles.

The division of the afternoon's spoils makes the Portland figures in the percentage column the same as they were yesterday.

Unless some serious accident happens, the Beavers will win the pennant.

With the pennant situation so rosy, the Beavers are now looking forward to what excitement and exhilaration their post-season series with the Oakland club will provide.

Tommy Sheehan, for Portland, was asked to name an umpire, as the Oakland club has already selected "Bull" Feltine.

In the first game of the bargain matinee here today "Fat" Dillon's importation, Palmer, pitched high-class ball all the way.

The second game was easy for Portland, as Tom Seaton pitched grand ball until the ninth, when he let up long enough to allow three Scraphic hits.

Cap Dillon was the star of the first game, as he pitched a lead of six runs at this time, so the batting rally held by the Dilonites was not alarming.

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Peckinpaugh also hooked one of the southpaw's shots for a two-ply bingle and Ryan and Krueger counted.

Five running catches by Krueger, Ryan, Dwyer and Lober enlivened the afternoon. These players distinguished themselves in both games.

"Speck" Harkness will be on the mound for Portland tomorrow, but Dillon is uncertain as to who his pitcher will be.

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BEAVERS' HOPE HIGH

Portland Almost Sure to Win 1911 Championship.

VERNON'S CHANCES SLIM

Villagers Cannot Be Victors Even if They Take 11 Remaining Contests, if McCredie's Men Get Seven More Games.

Ordinarily when a club is 23 points ahead in a pennant race on Friday, the 13th of the month, the hoodoo club holds the boards, but this morning, October 13, with 11 games to go, we are immensely pleased to make the announcement that Portland practically has clinched the Pacific Coast League pennant for the third time in the last six years.

Yesterday's fourth straight defeat for Vernon by the Oaks and Portland's split with the Scraphs puts the following dent in the statistic column: Portland, 108 wins and 73 defeats.

In other words, if Portland takes three of the scheduled four left with Los Angeles and four of the seven with San Francisco, or two of the four with the Angels and five of the seven with San Francisco, it will be an impossibility for Vernon to "cop the rag."

Delving a little deeper into the good old figures, if Vernon loses one game in the 11 yet to play, Portland will have to take but two of the four with the Angels and four of the seven with the Scraphs to repeat.
