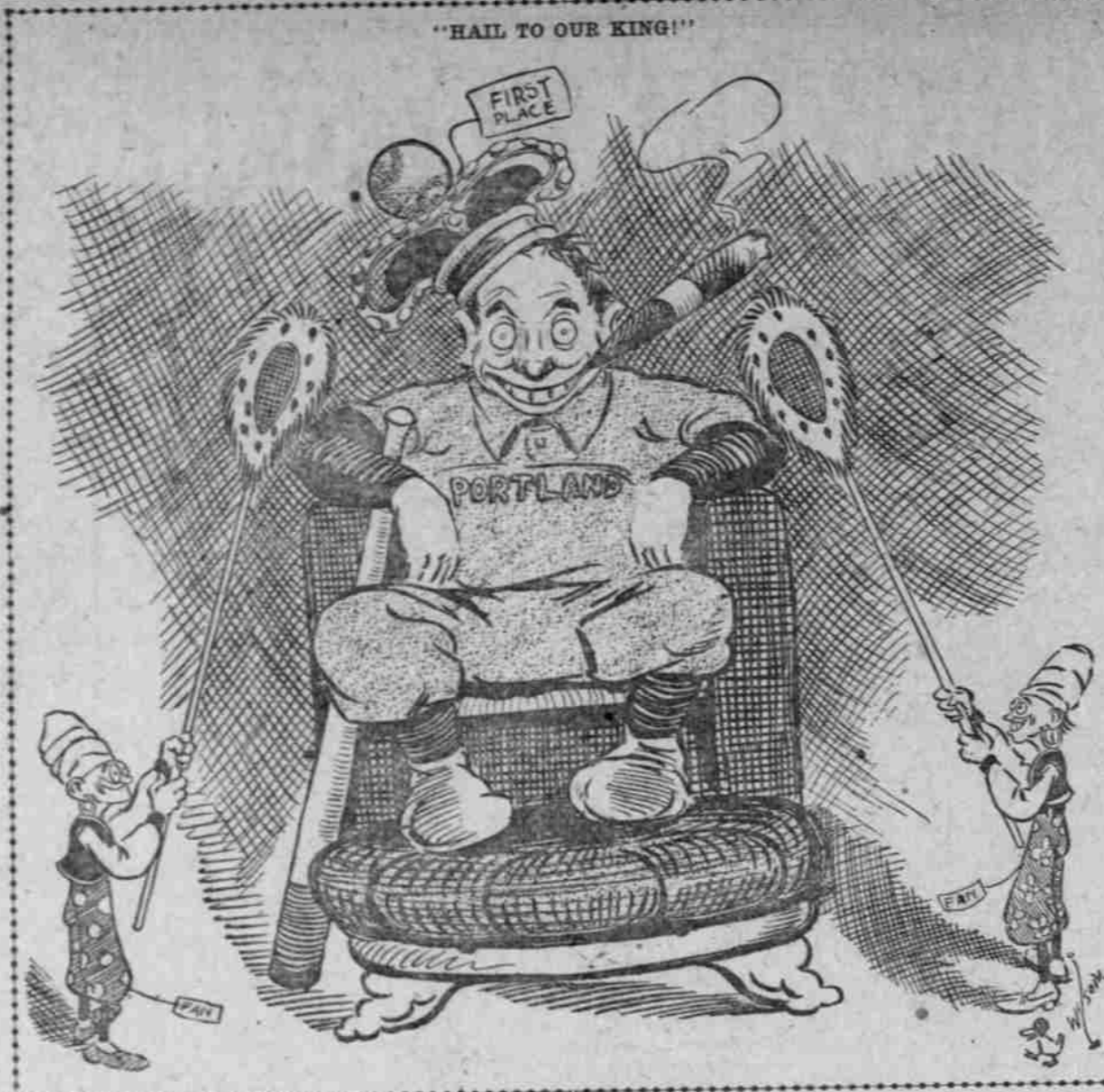
PRINEVILLE TAKES ANOTHER. In Fast, Snappy Ball Game Portland Just Misses Shutout.
