METAL WORKER IS KILLED

LIVE WIRE ON SUBSTATION RESPONSIBLE FOR FATAL INJURIES.

While working on the roof of a new addition to the sub-station of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company, near Leitz Junction, yesterday morning, Wesley Krupke, a sheet metal worker in the employ of Hirschberger & Company, of 247 Ankeny street, came in contact with a live wire and received injuries which resulted in his death about 5:30 last night.

THE ACCIDENT OCCURRED ABOUT 19 O'CLOCK, and he was immediately hurried to St. Vincent's Hospital. He never regained consciousness. He was badly burned about one side and hand, and it is also thought by Dr. Rockey, who attended him, that his skull was fractured.

Mrs. Krupke was 21 years old and resided with his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Ferdinand Krupke, at 224 Grant street. He was an only son. He had been a student in the Y. M. C. A. Night School in the sheet metal drafting class, and had made rapid strides in his chosen profession.

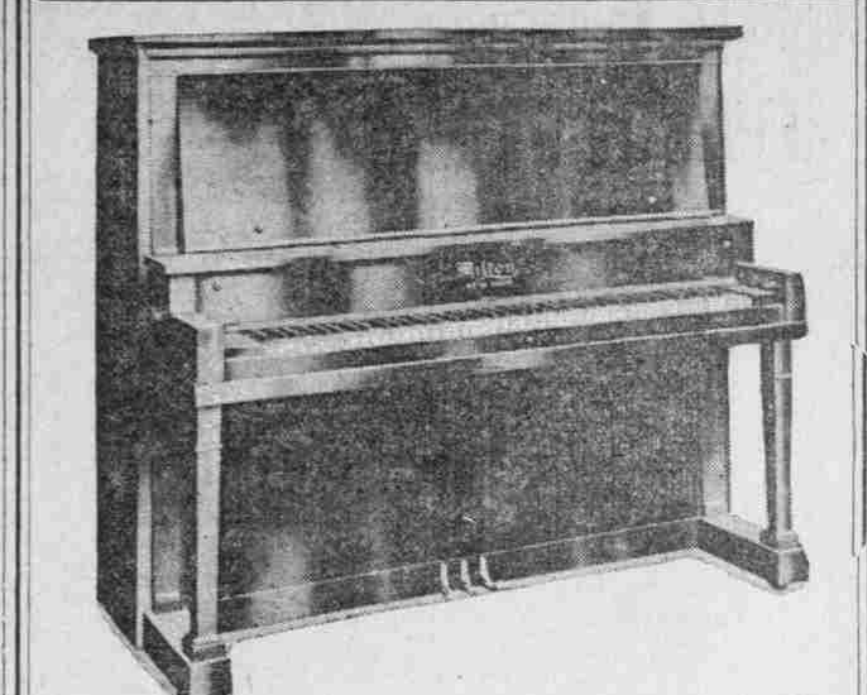

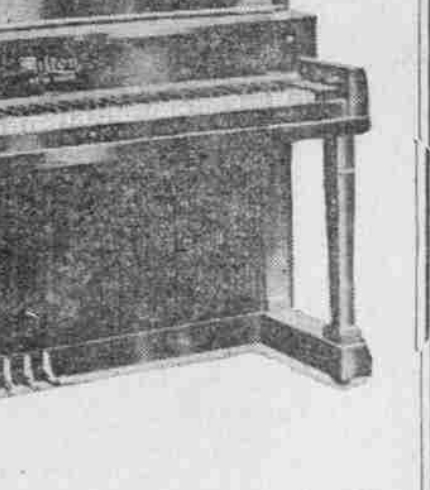
