

EAST SIDE PUSHES PUBLIC MARKETS

Resolutions Laying Out Districts and Calling for Designs Adopted.

COST REDUCTION POINTED

Present Plans Call for Building of Three Establishments, One to Be on West Side of River. Committees Are Selected.

Establishment of three public markets in Portland, one on the West Side and two on the East Side, owned and operated by the city of Portland, was unanimously advocated at the meeting of the East side committee of 15, held yesterday afternoon in the rooms of the East Side Business Men's Club.

Districts Are Outlined. The following resolutions were adopted as the general plan of action:

Resolved, That for the establishment of public markets, the city be divided into the following districts, to-wit: That there be two East Side and one West Side public market; that East Burnside street be the dividing line on the East Side and that a public market for the north district be established in the vicinity of Albina and one for the central and south district between Burnside and Hawthorne avenues.

Resolved, That the Mayor and Council be requested to have the building inspector or some other architect prepare plans for suitable market buildings for squares or blocks of three or four lots.

CITY DODGES MORE DEBT

Forest Grove Rejects Church Offer to Sell City Hall Site.

FOREST GROVE, Or., Oct. 19.—(Special.)—Because of the heavy bond indebtedness, due to the installation of a gravity water system and the cost of the intersections of 13 blocks of pavement and a desire to build within a short time a sewer system, the City Council has decided to reject the offer of the First Congregational Church to sell to the city at a liberal consideration the south half of the "church square," where a City Hall could be erected and a public park maintained in the heart of the business district.
