

IMMENSE STORE TO RISE AT ONCE

Aaron Holtz and Associates Complete Plans to Build at Fifth and Washington.

RAZING BEGINS WEDNESDAY

\$250,000 Seven-Story Department Shop to Be Completed by Next June—Big Steel Canopy Among Modern Features.

With the completion of the details of the lease deal for the northwest corner of Fifth and Washington streets with the Mead Estate yesterday, Aaron Holtz and associates announce that work will begin immediately on the seven-story department-store building.

The building will be of structural steel, pressed brick and terra cotta exterior and will cost approximately \$250,000. It will be fully fireproof and one of the most modern buildings for department store uses in the Northwest.

Street Canopy Planned. The building will occupy the full quarter block, will contain seven stories and full basement. As the location is one of the best transfer corners in the city we will have a metal canopy extending for the full width on both streets to provide shelter for pedestrians.

Plans for the new building have been prepared by Doyle, Patterson & Beach. The company has a lease on the property for a 25-year term.
