ALL MAY COME BACK
CIVIL SERVICE BOARD ACTS ON REINSTATEMENT.

Holden's Prayer to Be Reappointed to Fire Department Brings About Change—Limit Is Dropped.

Under a rule adopted yesterday by the Civil Service Commission a city employe who has resigned from any department of the service may be reinstated at any time afterward, at the discretion of the Commission.

Extension of the Oregon Electric to McMinnville before the end of 1913 virtually was promised by Carl R. Gray, president of the Hill Lines in Oregon, on his first visit to that city, from which he returned yesterday.

Mr. Gray was impressed with McMinnville and the territory surrounding it, and expressed his belief that it has possibilities equal to those of the Willamette Valley, which he already has pronounced the best stretch of farming country he ever has seen.

With Mr. Gray on the McMinnville trip were W. E. Coman, general freight and passenger agent; Charles H. Carney, attorney for the Hill Lines, and L. H. Wickersham, chief engineer. The party was entertained by representative business men of the territory.

Although he did not set a date for beginning construction work on the McMinnville branch, he declared that it will be completed and in operation before the end of the next two years.

This came as pleasing news to the McMinnville citizens, who have been praying for better rail facilities ever since the Oregon Electric began building its lines. The company already has obtained terminal facilities at McMinnville, and has an excellent depot site there.

Considerable right of way has been obtained. The farmers on the route of the proposed line are eager to have it built, and the right-of-way problem, it is believed, will be a simple one.

To start the McMinnville line soon after the Oregon Electric is extended to Eugene seems the objective of being formulated by the Hill interests. It is probable that work will be started there in the Spring of 1912. The exact route has not been determined, but it is believed that it will be most desirable to connect with the main line about 10 or 15 miles south of Portland and to build via Newburg.
