

CHARTER MAKING MAY END TODAY

Official Commission Hurries to Complete Its Draft by Tomorrow.

PARTIAL REPORT PASSED

Kills Amendment to Be Choked to Include All Street Work—and Auditorium Bodies Are Retained.

The official Charter Commission is endeavoring to finish its work in time to submit the draft to the City Auditor tomorrow.

Price Not Cut, Say Two. Mr. Grout and John H. Burghard declared the bill amendment has not yet cut the price of paving.

"The bill amendment does not cure present evils because we have a paving trust," remarked J. E. Worlein.

It was decided to retain the Dock Commission and Auditorium Commission as at present, after considerable discussion.

Abolishment is Opposed. Other members of the committee declared the Dock Commission and Auditorium Commission could be done away with later.

GRANGE CHANGES FOUGHT. Rockwood Chapter of Order Against Higher State Dues.

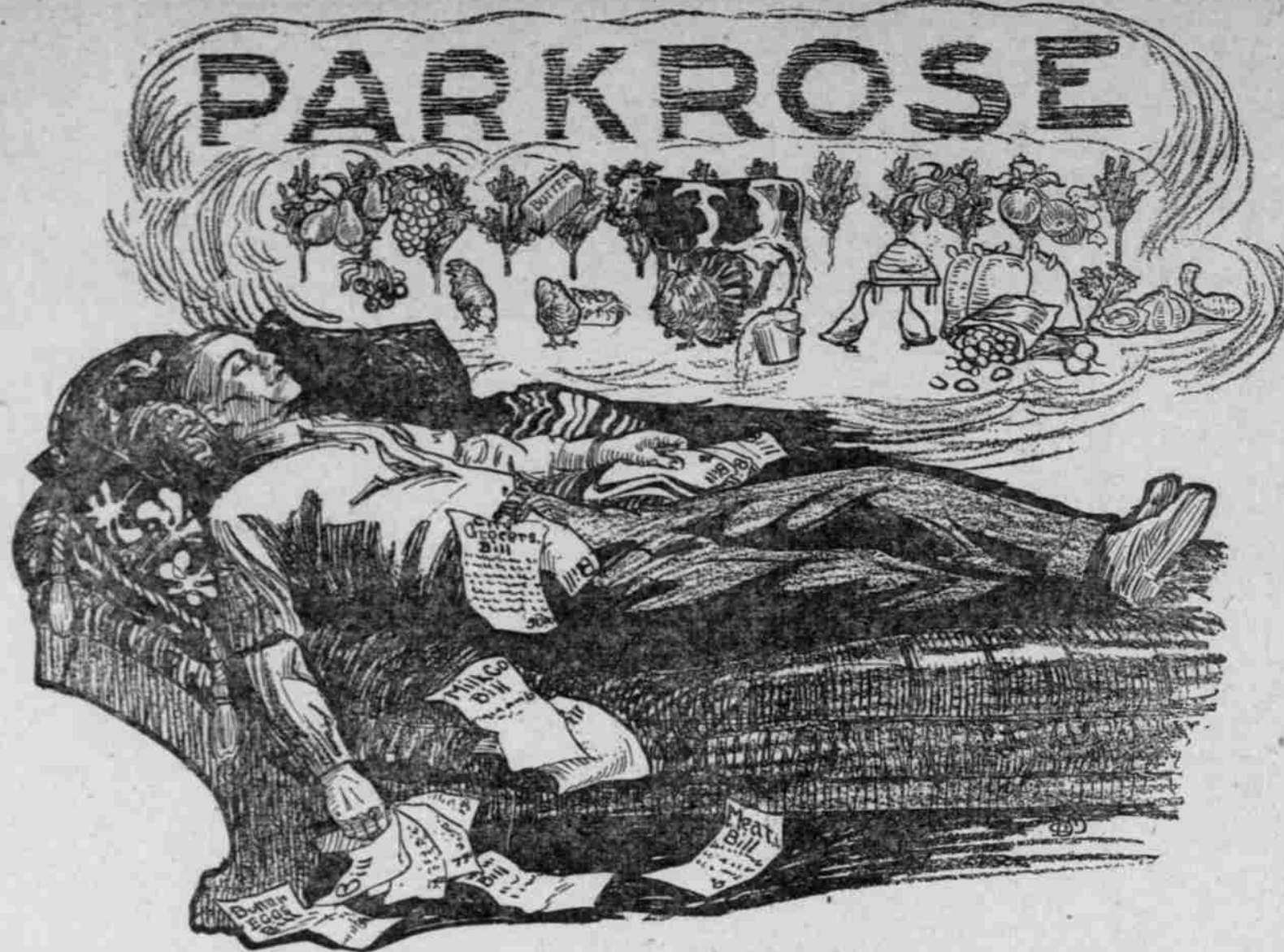
