OREGON CITY FARE IS CUT FIVE CENTS

Portland Railway, Light & Power Company Ordered to Reduce Rates.

WAY POINTS BENEFIT, TOO

Railroad Commission, in Ruling Effective in 20 Days, Also Cuts Fares on Springwater Division and Orders Transfers.

BALEM, Or. Nov. 1.—(Special)—
Sweeping reductions in rates on the
line of the Pertland Railway, Light &
Power Company between its Portland
terminus at First and Alder streats,
and Oregon City, and on the Springwater division of the same road, between that point and Portland, are
ordered in a ruling made public today
by the State Baliread Commission in
five rate cases brought before it.
The principal adjustment in the
rates is on the Oregon City division,
the fares on that line being based on
the Hpringwater division short-line
rate. One of the reductions ordered
is in the through rate between Portland and Oregon City, now 25 cents,
which has been ordered cut to 20 cents.
Commutation tleases between Portland
and Oregon City can hereafter be

and Oregon City can hereafter be bought for 18 cents.

Amount the other reductions is the granting of a straight 5-cent fare to passengers between Ardgour and Hendee, stations just outside Portland, to that city. Bull transfer, artificiant. that city. Full transfer privileges are also included.

Transfer Privileges Granted.

One of the principal contentions prayed for in the five cases brought before the Commission was the same transfer privilege for all patrons on the Oregon City and Springwater divisions as is now granted to passengers on the Mount Scott line. This privilege the car company is directed to grant. The five cases included three complaints brought by M. E. Dunn, Paul Relmers and the Jennings Lodge Community Club, and two investigations started by the Commission on its own motion.

The complaint of Dune, who was represented by George C. Brownell, reinted to the alleged unreasonableness of the one-way or single-trip fares over the road between Canemah, Oregon City. Park Fince, Gladatone, Fern Ridge, Meldrum, Jennings, Rothe, Naef and Compret, all in Clackamas County, and the Portland terminus. The complaint elleged that unjust discrimination had been practiced against these stations in favor of stations similarly situated on the Springwater division, especially in the rule denying transfer privileges to passengers between Clackamas County points and Portland.


