The purpose of the measure seems to have been to create a good roads fund, and under its previsions the Board of County Commissioners were invested with power to levy at their discretion a poil tax en each person not to exceed \$4. Unlike most poil tax laws, it made no exemptions, but included women as woll as men—for Idaho has weman suffrage—widows and old soldiers, the lume, the halt, the blind and the insane. All that was necessary to be taxed was for the person to be at least 21 years of age.

The Board of this county, however, eager to secure a road fund, paid no heed to public sentiment, and made an order levying a poil tax of \$2 on every person, and instructed the road appeared to the Board to revoke its order, but it declined, and then trouble came.



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
