

APPEAL RATE CASES IS FILED

Government Holds Commerce Court Erred in Ruling on Short-Haul Clause.

EARLY HEARING INDICATED

Motion for Final Decree in Interstate Mountain Rate Cases Also to Be Allowed and Appeals to Be Consolidated.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.—Counsel for the Government filed today with the Commerce Court a writ of appeal in the transcontinental rate cases.

In the assignment of errors, Government counsel assert that the Commerce Court, in granting the preliminary injunctions against the orders of the Interstate Commerce Commission, did not take cognizance of the facts that the deposition and affidavits of the railway asking the injunctions do not set forth a sufficient cause to warrant the granting of the preliminary injunctions or to form the basis for relief from the Commission's order.

Showing of Equity Denied. It is contended also that the petitioners did not show that there is any equity in their petition upon which to grant the injunction.

The Government's counsel contends that the court erred in holding that the new does not authorize the Commission to prescribe the percentage basis of rates, and in maintaining that the Commission's orders were unconstitutional and void because they were beyond the power of the Commission to issue.

Injunction Called Error. It is asserted the court erred also in granting the preliminary injunction in the long and short haul cases particularly because the Commission in issuing the order proceeded entirely in accordance with the law.

Appeals to Be Consolidated. The motion, filed by the Government counsel, is to have a final decree entered in the interstate cases as well as be granted by the Commerce Court, to facilitate consideration of the cases before the Supreme Court.

WATSONVILLE, Cal., Nov. 21.—Mrs. George Hall, 42 years of age, a native of Ohio, was accidentally shot and instantly killed last night by her 7-year-old daughter, who was trying to shield her from attack by the girl's father. Hall and the girl, who is wild with grief today, are being held here to await action by the coroner.

SPECIAL SESSION CALLED. Free Textbooks Among 26 Subjects for Californians to Consider.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., Nov. 21.—Governor Johnson issued today his official call for the extraordinary session of the Legislature, to begin November 27. Free textbooks, reapportionment, a Presidential preference primary, the enactment of a law placing the advertisement of state officials or departments of the state government under the charge, control and supervision of the State Board of Control, and enacting laws to put into operation the several amendments to the state constitution, are among the subjects included in the call. There are 26 subjects named in the call.

WARSHIPS ORDERED TO SANTO DOMINGO

Government Prompt to Take Action, Following Assassination of Caceres.

VESSELS RESPOND QUICKLY

Movement Intended Chiefly as Notice to Foreign Nations That Their Citizens' Interests Will Be Protected.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.—The Cabinet decided today that the situation in Santo Domingo was such, as the result of the assassination of President Caceres, as to make it expedient for the United States to have naval forces there sufficient to meet any demands for the protection of American lives and property and to insure the maintenance of order.

Other Nations Fear Calamity. There is nothing on the surface indicating danger of serious trouble in Santo Domingo, but the decision to send this powerful naval force to the island was inspired by a desire to relieve any other nation from apprehension as to the safety of its citizens or their property.
