REPLY TO COUNTY.

Corporation Declares Lord's Code and Acts of Congress Permit Use of Roads-Cleeton Threatens.

The County Court yesterday re-ceived from Carey & Kerr, attorneys for the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company, a letter in answer to that from the Commissioners demanding to know by what right the company occupies the county roads with its poles and wires. The reply, which was written by Harrison Allen, sets forth that Lord's Oregon Laws give companies and high subject to the conthat Lord's Oregon Laws give com-panies such right, subject to the con-trol of County Courts, and that an act of Congress of July 74, 1866, per-mits telegraph companies to utilize all military highways or post roads then in existence or afterward to be created by law. Continuing, Mr. Alien declares that another act of Congress.

declares that another act of Congress, of March 1. 1884, designated all roads and highways as post roads.

The investigation was undertaken by the County Court with a view to force the company to give the county free telephone service in return for the use of the county roads, just as the city is allowed the greater number of its telephones free in exchange for franchise privileges. The Commissioners at once replied to the letter of the company's attorneys, calling attention ompany's attorneys, calling attention to the fact that the state law referred to excepts streets, highways and roads within the incorporated limits.

land, Gresham, Linnton and other mu-nicipalities within the county," said County Judge Cleeton. "These roads have never been taken over by the va-

26 NOT VACCINATED ILL Epidemic at Toledo Puts Town in Hard Straits for Time

"The effectiveness of vaccination is "The effectiveness of vaccination is conclusively demonstrated in the smallpox epidemic now existing at Toledo, Oregon. Conditions there should forever silence the critics, who have been railing against vaccination." said Dr. Calvin S. White, secretary of the State Board of Health, in referring to the situation at the Lincoln County seat yesterday. There are now 26 cases of smallpox in that town, four cases of smallpox in that town, four new cases having been reported yes-terday, and of these not a single per-son has ever been vaccinated.

One of the cases reported yesterday was that of Mrs. B. Arden, 85 years old, who refused to submit to vaccin-ation, although seven in her family have been vaccinated and are not affacted. She is the mother of Frank Carson, the village blacksmith, who was attacked with smallpox several years ago. Of the cases now at Toledo but three are of the severe type. The grimness of the epidemic is broken by touches of humor. When the epidemic broke out all sought seclusion, and it was difficult to find persons to perform the necessary pubpersons to perform the necessary public duties, among them that of policing the town. Finally one of the patients approached a convalescent stage, and he was promptly designated Town Marshal, on the theory that he could no longer suffer harm. One of could no longer suffer harm.
