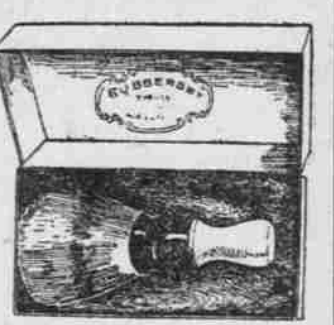

## PROJECT FOES BAND

### Stanfield to Continue Fight on Umatilla Extension.

## ORGANIZATION IS FORMED

### Waterusers' Association Declares Its Purpose to Oppose Any Plan for Construction Which Jeopardizes Their Interest.

PENDLETON, Or., Dec. 14.—(Special.)—Announcing that it had no intention of giving up the fight against the proposed extension of the Umatilla project, an organization known as the Umatilla County Waterusers' Association today gave out resolutions stating the position of the association.

The organization was formed at the instance of the Stanfield remonstrators and purports to include within its membership the users of water in the vicinity of Stanfield and Echo, as well as those along Birch and McKay creeks.

State Senator J. N. Burgess, of Pilot Rock, is the president, while G. L. Hurd, of Stanfield, is the secretary.

The resolutions which were signed by the officers declare the members of the association are opposed to any plan for the construction of the West Umatilla project which jeopardizes or would result in the diminishment of the present prior appropriators of water along the upper river and tributaries, but that they are in favor of the construction of the project by the Government to provide for the irrigation of lands as heretofore provided, that only such waters shall be used as are now appurtenant to the lands proposed to be included in the extension, to-wit, the lands of the Oregon Land & Water Company at Irrigon, the lands of the Western Land & Irrigation Company where the irrigation systems of these companies would be superseded and rendered unnecessary.

The resolutions also demand the immediate dismissal of the adjudication suits brought by the Government to determine the exact water rights of users of water from the Umatilla River and its tributary streams.

## WOMAN'S HEART IN COURT

### Organ Produced to Prove Contention Against Alleged Assassin.

AURORA, Ill., Dec. 14.—The heart of Mrs. Estelle Dumas, a wealthy woman of Pontiac, Ill., killed a year ago, was brought into a crowded courtroom at Keokuk, Ill., today in the trial of Henry W. Morris, of Peoria, the alleged assassin.

The judge ruled that if the contention of the prosecution that Morris had shot the woman through the heart were disputed, the organ might go in as exhibit "A."

## FARMERS TO HAVE SCHOOL

### Lecture Courses to Be Given at Puyallup Experiment Station.

TACOMA, Wash., Dec. 14.—(Special.)—As a result of energetic pleas by the

people of Puyallup Valley, backed by the Puyallup Commercial Club, announcement just been made of a farmers' school to be established in connection with the Western Washington State Experimental Station, at Puyallup. The school will be what is known as an short course, and the first session will be held the latter part of January. Lectures on various farm topics will be given by practical and experienced men who have made a success on their own farms.

Professor George Severance, of the Western Washington station, will have charge of the school, assisted by some of the faculty from Pullman College and it will be open to all who desire to enter.

The courses will include lectures by Professor Abby, of Pullman College, on hog production, feeding, handling and marketing, and lectures by Professor A. B. Nyström, of the dairy department of Pullman College, on dairying. Professor Severance is also arranging for lectures by F. Walder, of Seattle, on practical horticulture.

The domestic science department of the school will be in charge of Miss Barry, of Pullman College, and will be conducted for the benefit of the farmers' wives and daughters.

H. L. Blanchard, L. J. Chapin and J. L. Stahl, of the Western Washington station, will lecture on grains, grasses, soils, poultry and horticulture as adapted to Western Washington. Senator W. H. Paulhamus is also scheduled for an address.

## GILL AGAIN CANDIDATE

### RECALLED SEATTLE MAYOR SEEKS NOMINATION.

### Both He and Parish Circulating Petitions—Redelsheimer and Cotterill May Enter Race.

SEATTLE, Wash., Dec. 14.—(Special.)—The mayoralty candidates of Tax Commissioner T. A. Parish and ex-Mayor Hiram Charles Gill have reached the petition stage. Industrious circulators are scattered throughout the city to gather in names to back the Parish mayoralty ambition, while the preliminary work is accomplished in Gill's behalf and will be followed immediately by the assignment of canvassers.

If Parish and Gill comb the town for signatures they may consciously or unconsciously eliminate one mayoralty candidate in the process.

J. Redelsheimer has flirted with the mayoralty, but he has refused to take the campaign seriously unless given the support of business interests through a petition urging his candidacy.

Ex-State Senator George Cotterill, whom most of those interested in politics assume will be a candidate, but whom nobody has authority to speak for, was still non-committal this morning as he was several weeks ago when the Cotterill boom was launched. Both Gill and Parish and the friends of the two men have accepted a Cotterill candidacy as one of the probabilities.

## Portland Men to Enter Pleas.

KLAMATH FALLS, Or., Dec. 14.—(Special.)—Samuel A. McMahon and James H. Hughes, of Portland, representing the Rudolph S. Home Paving Company, indicted on three counts for alleged attempts to bribe Mayor Fred T. Sanderson, Councilman Russell A. Alford and Councilman Marion Hanks, have come to the city to enter their pleas, having been liberated some weeks ago on surety furnished by a bonding company. After they plead

they probably will return to Portland, as the case is not expected to reach the criminal calendar until after the first of the year, when Judge Percy R. Kelly will return to Albany and Judge Henry L. Benson, who exchanged with him, will resume his seat on the circuit bench here.

## Macadamized Road Survey Is On.

HUSUM, Wash., Dec. 14.—(Special.)—

The Northwestern Electric Company began the survey Tuesday for their macadamized road from the dam site on the White Salmon River at the Charles Frick place, four miles below here, to a junction with the Underwood-Husum

county road, under the direction of Engineer Clegg. The road will be 30 feet wide. A concrete mixer has been shipped to Underwood for use at the power site. The management of the Northwestern company asserts that the

road to the S. P. & S. track at Underwood will be built suitable for large auto trucks in hauling their supplies to the site on the river where their high concrete dam is to be erected.
