Secretary Urges \$814,000 for Tillamook Bay.

PORT TO BEAR ONE-HALF

Channel of 16 Feet at Bay City Is Contemplated-Large Sawmill, to Cost Million Dollars,

to Follow.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Dec. 31 .- The Secretary of War today transmitted to Congress with his approval the report of the Army engiof the north jetty at entrance Tillamook Bay and the dredging of a channel 200 feet wide and 16 feet geep from

The entrance to Hay City at an estimated cost \$514,000, on condition that local interests bind themselves to delray half As the Port of Tillamook and the bort of Bay City have pledged them-elves to raise half this amount, the agineers recommend that Congress this session appropriate \$200,000 cash to start the work and adopt a continu-ing contract for the remaining \$207,000 of the Government's share, it being un-derstood that local funds will be made

available as needed, so that work, once regun, can be carried forward rapidly Original Pians Modified.

The original report of engineers recommended two jettles at the entrance to Tillamook Bay, a 18-foot channel to Bay City and a 14-foot channel to Tillamook City, at an estimated cost of \$12.06,650, but this plan was rejected by the Rivers and Harbors itourd as being the recommendation. too expensive. The plan was then mod-lified to cut out the improvement above Hay city, reducing the cost to \$1,784.000 on condition that local interests hear 25 per cent of the cost, but this bear 25 per cent of the cost, but this also was rejected and only recently one letty plan on the half-and-half basis was submitted and approved. It is said in the report that if one jetty proves inadequate, the question of building a accord jetty will produce the desired 20-foot depth across Tillamook Bar and if this preves to be the case-no further project will be necessary.

Early Consideration Likely.

This modified report will be considered by the rivers and harbors committee and included in its new bill this Winter.

As seen as the appropriation for the despening of the channel from Tillamook Bay is made by the Government a large sawmill will probably be creeted at Bay City, in cost probably \$1,800,000.
