MEDFORD, Or., Jan. 25.—(Special.)— That Oregon, Kansas and Wisconsin are to be the objective points of the National suffragist campaign in 1912 was the statement of Mrs. Helen Hoy Greely, a prominent equal suffrage advocate of New York, before a mass meeting of women at the Hotel Medford

We have California and Washington, said Mrs. Greely, and with Oregon we will have possession of the Tacific Coast. I make the prediction that Oregon will go for equal suffrage year by an overwhelming ma-

Mrs. Greely was accompanied by Miss Charlotte Whitney, president of the College Equal Suffrage League of San Francisco, who also addressed the meeting. E. E. Kelly, of Medford spoke of the legal status of women in Ore-gon.

Many courtesies were extended the two visitors in the way of luncheons and teas, but Medford women were plainly indifferent to the cause as an active issue. In spite of the urgent request of the visitors, no local canization was formed.


