Fuller, of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company, and also with officials of the Mount Hood Railway & Power Company for the past few days in regard to the proposed railroad extension through that district. One of the conditions of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company in its offer to operate an extension is that the property-owners shall build the track and guarantee the payment of \$500 a month income to the car operated over the extension. NEW BRIDGE IS DELAYED

RAILWAY SPAN NOT TO BE FINISHED UNTIL MAY.

County Court May Rescind Order Stopping Vehicle Traffic. Rental Is Issued.

The receipt of a telephone message yesterday from J. P. O'Brien, general manager of the O.-W. R. & N. Company, to the effect that the new railroad bridge will not be ready for traffic till May 15, possibly not till June 1, probably will change the plans of the County Court, which had announced that the present railroad bridge would be closed to vehicle traffic today. In view of the long wait in store it is probable that the County Commissioners will put a force of men at work repairing the worst places in the deck of the present bridge, as it is admitted that to be without the bridge till June would work a hardship on the public. The view previously taken by the County Court, when it was expected that the completion of the new

BRIDGE WAS A MATTER OF FEW WEEKS ONLY, WAS THAT IT WOULD NOT PAY TO MAKE THE REPAIRS.

It costs the county \$700 a month to operate the bridge, \$250 being the monthly rental paid the railway company and \$450 the cost of operating the draw. In case the bridge had been closed to vehicle traffic it was the intention of the County Court to ask that the rental be discontinued. In case of refusal the Commissioners had resolved to stop pedestrian traffic across the bridge also, and force the railway company to pay the expense of operating the draw.

OI SEN STOLIDLY DENIES

CHINESE, HOWEVER, CONFIDENT SHE IS MURDERESS.

Officer Will Seek Extradition of Woman From Montana Today. Special Guard Placed.

Stubborn denial of identity as Oi Sen, alleged murderer of Sold Bing, is made by a woman under arrest at Billings for the crime and for whose return here Detective Day is now on his way to Billings. Police officers and Chinese here, however, maintain their confidence that there can be no mistake, basing their opinion upon the description of the woman and the papers in her possession, in the name of Oi Sen. These include a receipt for the money paid for a revolver, known to have been bought here by Oi Sen, and papers showing that Oi Sen pawned for \$120 a ring which has been identified as the property of Sold Bing. The Billings woman, according to dispatches received yesterday, admits that she lived at Pendleton and passed

much time in Portland. A guard has been placed over her at the Billings jail to ensure that she will not commit suicide or be killed by some assassin.

The police here believe that the Billings police have acted upon information from Chinese sources and that

there can be no question about the woman being the right one.

Detective Day is due to arrive in Helena today, when he will lay his papers before the Governor of Montana and request a warrant for the woman's extradition.
