GRACE LUMBER FLEET LARGE

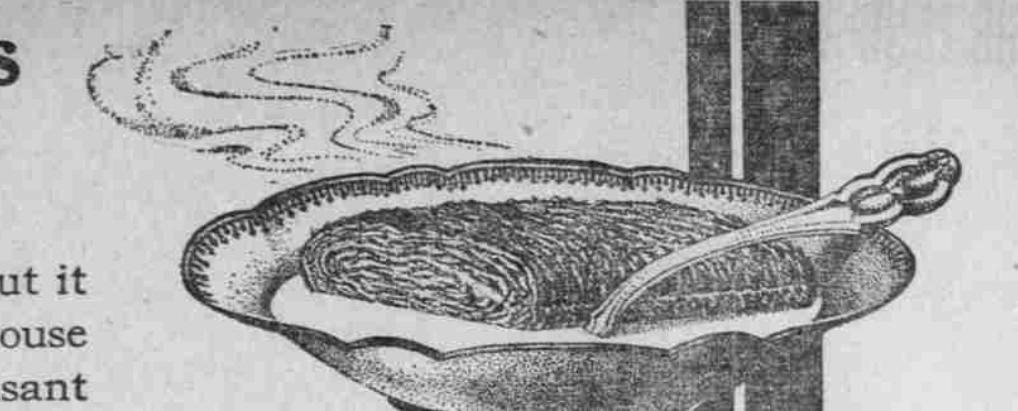

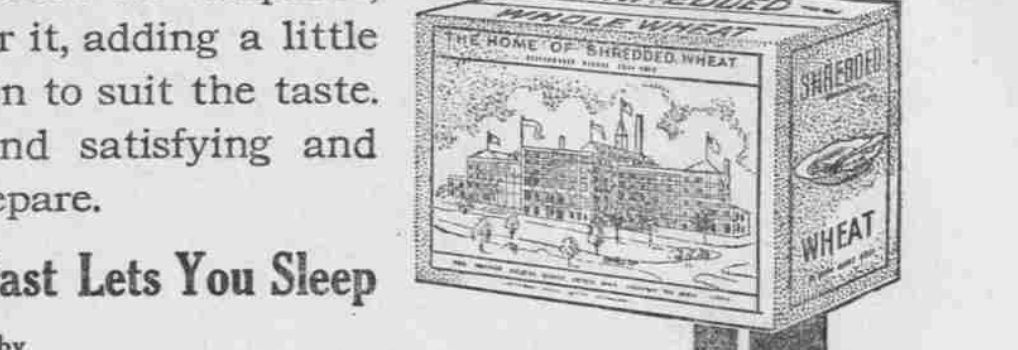

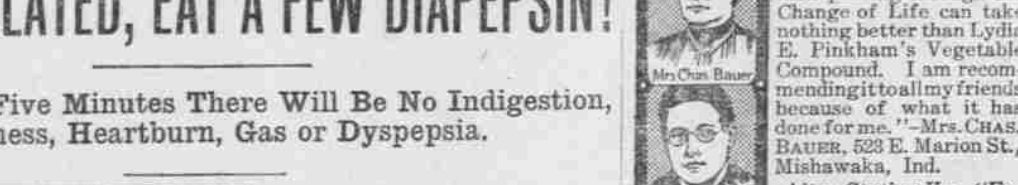
