

TRIP TO FAIR SITE WILL BEGIN TODAY

Excursionists Get Invitation to Join "Oregon Day" Rites at Los Angeles Land Show.

COMMITTEE GIVEN HONOR

Julius Meier, Chairman of Commission, Compliments Co-Workers With Luncheon at Which Leaders Tell of Success.

Julius Meier, chairman of the Oregon Commission for the Panama-Pacific Exposition, received a telegram from Los Angeles late yesterday afternoon notifying him that the arrangement committee of that city had provided another feature to add to the entertainment of the Oregon excursion...

Mr. Meier already had been notified that March 14 had been made Oregon day at the Los Angeles land show and that the entire delegation was invited to be the guest of the city at that time.

Yesterday's announcement told that arrangements had been made to run excursions in the fast steamer Yale and Harvard during the entire stay of the Oregon delegation in California.

The final meeting of the committee in charge of the excursion was held yesterday at a luncheon given in their honor by Mr. Meier in the dining-room at the Meier & Frank store.

Reports of the committee members were reviewed at the luncheon and Charles C. Mills, a prominent business authority, who has been in San Francisco assisting in the arrangements for the livestock exhibits at the Panama-Pacific Exposition, gave an interesting talk on the work.

Others present were G. M. Hyland, A. C. Callan, L. F. Weaver, C. H. Moore, C. H. Merrick, C. F. Bore, L. A. Collins, J. Fred Larson, W. J. Hofmann, J. P. Carroll, E. J. Hall and A. A. Schell.

The work of the membership committee was reviewed by several members of the committee and will be taken to San Francisco on the special train, to mark the site selected for the Oregon building.

A committee will be at the station at 10:30 this morning to assist members of the excursion in arranging to have their baggage checked through to the Oregon headquarters at the St. Francis Hotel in San Francisco.

It was announced yesterday that a special train on the return trip would leave San Francisco on Sunday at 3:30 P. M., reaching Portland at 3:30 P. M. the following day.
