OPTIMISM SHOWN AT MEXICO CITY

Popular Demonstration of Loyalty on Sunday Encourages the Officials.

EXPECTED

Life or Death of Revolution to Be Decided in Vicinity of Torreon in Next Few Days-Americans Gain Confidence.

MEXICO CITY, March 11.-A decided feeling of optimien pervaded the capital today, affecting foreigners and Mexicans alike. The popular demonstration of loyalty to the government posterior has stiffened the bocks of government officials and private

covernment officials and private citizens.

This fact was munifest today by a material increase in the number of enlistments for army service. Business men generally profess to see a great improvement in the outlook.

Everywhere the opinion was expressed that the life or death of the cevolution depends upon the developments in the next few days in the vicinity of Torreon. A sentiment of resourced confidence in the ability of the federals to deliver a crushing blow to order was shown.

Government officials say that in addition to the 2500 men already at Torreon, as many more can be equipped and sent there if nocessary.


