

WOOL SELLS FREELY

Heavy Business Passing in New Washington Clip.

HALF OF IT DISPOSED

About 500,000 Pounds Bought This Week by Portland and Eastern Dealers—Price Over Cent Better Than Last Year.

Wool has been selling freely in Washington this week and about half of 500,000 clip has been disposed of between \$20.00 and \$20.50 per pound.

The Yakima sheep are shown early so as to reach the market before lambing time. There has been a little shorting at scattered points in Eastern Oregon, but in general shearing operations will not be under way before the middle of April.

Erratic Course of Standard Oil on the Curb—Harriman's Sell Off on Publication of February Earnings.

NEW YORK, March 28.—For the third successive session today's stock market receded further behind its starting line.

Apparently sentiment continued to be adversely affected by the report regarding the United States Steel Corporation, although the bond sale is construed as notice that the stock is in no immediate danger of disturbance.

The market opened with a heavy decline in Harriman's issue were conspicuous for their strength during the early session.

United States Steel, Amalgamated Copper and American Smelting, with other recent favorites, sold at lowest prices of the week.

On the curb one of the Standard Oil subsidiaries, the Standard Oil Company of Kentucky, advanced to 100.00, from which it subsequently dropped to 95.00.

The bond market was steady. Total sales were \$2,441,000. United States bonds were unchanged on call.
