SACRAMENTO, Cal., April 8.—Governor Johnson gave out a statement yesterday explaining the action of the La Follette League of California in transferring its support from Senator La Follette to Colonel Roosevelt.

Accompanying the statement were copies of a letter, including one signed by Gifford Pinchot, Representative Kent of California, and others.

La Follette Thought Out of Race. "It was not until after La Follette's friends had been assured by Mr. Houser that in his opinion Senator La Follette was entirely out of the race and that Roosevelt was the only candidate that could advance the progressive cause that they joined in the movement to secure the nomination and election of Colonel Roosevelt."

So much misrepresentation has been indulged in concerning the attitude of the progressives of California in this campaign that reluctantly I make this statement of the facts. In doing so I want to make plain that I shall not permit this contest to be transmuted into a personal one.
