Bringing the assurance that the nomination of President Taft is as good as made, Ralph D. Cole, ex-Representative in Congress from Ohio, arrived in Portland yesterday and will devote the next ten days to a tour of the state in support of the President's candidacy. Mr. Cole will open the Taft campaign with an address at McMinnville tonight, Sunday excepted, he will speak every night, concluding the campaign with a meeting at Ontario Thursday night, April 18, the day before the primary election.

Taft's Strength Pointed Out. "The President's friends will dominate the Vermont convention by two to one, and in Kentucky state convention Taft will have delegates from all but one district. Iowa is also in the Taft column as a result of last week's elections. With the election of Taft delegates from Pennsylvania and Ohio, the nomination of the President will be virtually assured.

Big Victory for Taft Predicted. The Congressional district in which I reside is said to have been the most radical Roosevelt district in the state. However, the Congressional committee composed of two men from each county in the district, met ten days ago and endorsed President Taft without a dissenting vote. The Congressional committee in Mr. Brown's own district has endorsed President Taft. I am confident Taft will carry the State of Ohio through to our primaries which will be held May 25.

Taft Said to Be Confident. From the standpoint of substantial and lasting achievements, his Administration will compare favorably with the best, and there is a growing sentiment that if President Taft receded a vote of confidence and returned to the White House for four years more, his Administration will be surpassed by none in the history of the Republic.

Candidates Picnic Next Sunday. Candidates for every office from United States Senator to constable are invited to attend an open-air political picnic at Aloha, a town on the Southern Pacific in Eastern Washington County, 14 miles from Portland, next Sunday. The name of the town is Hawaiian word, meaning "you are welcome." Excursionists will leave at 1:00 p.m. from Portland, next Sunday, for the picnic grounds at Aloha. The committee in charge predicts that fully 1,000 farmers and their families from Gaston, Forest Grove, Hillsboro, Roseville and Beaverton will attend the day's outing.

Geer and Fulton to Speak. In addition to the meetings that will be addressed by Dr. John Wesley Hill, of New York, and Ralph D. Cole, of Ohio, in advocacy of President Taft, two other meetings have been arranged by the Portland Taft committee. T. T. Geer, ex-Governor, will address the voters of Green Valley and vicinity, at 8 o'clock tomorrow night. Saturday afternoon, C. W. Fulton, ex-United States Senator, will speak at Dallas.
