The \$75,000 disbursament would reduce this to \$105,000 and the liquidation of \$124,000 of securities listed by Bank Examiner Wright as approved would leave a surplus of \$13,000. It is proposed to offer the rest of the stock to directors of the old institution and to investors and should the scheme prove successful the bank would have \$160,000 in addition to the \$15,000 surplus with which to start business. MacGibbon and Charles J. Kleeman, who is associated with Mac-Gibbon in working out the plan, believe that it is feasible and will meet with success.
