### BANK MAY REORGANIZE

#### MACGIBBON ASKS COURT TO WITHHOLD DIVIDEND.

#### Payment of 45 Per Cent on Preferred Claims Ordered Over Protest of ex-Cashier.

Over the protest of George L. MacGibbon, ex-cashier of the American Bank & Trust Company, Presiding Judge Kavanaugh has signed an order directing H. E. Albert, special deputy in charge of the bank under Bank Examiner Wright, to declare and pay a dividend of 45 per cent on the preferred claims of the defunct institution. the bank, and that the assets should not be disturbed.

The preferred claims amount to \$166,752.50 and the amount to be distributed by Mr. Albert is \$75,118.82. The total amount of cash now in his possession is \$50,161.84, the collections having been \$83,121.94 and the disbursements necessary to winding up the business \$252,919. The distribution will be made May 16.

MacGibbon said that he had secured stock subscriptions to the extent of \$45,000.

A meeting to discuss reorganization has been called by a committee of the depositors for Saturday night. The scheme now being worked out provides for the turning over of the entire capital stock of the bank, 1500 shares of the par value of \$100 a share, to the reorganization committee, for sale at \$150 a share. The sale of this would realize \$225,000. One-third of it is said to have already been subscribed. The bank's liabilities are approximately \$110,000. The \$75,000 disbursement would reduce this to \$105,000 and the liquidation of \$124,000 of securities listed by Bank Examiner Wright as approved would leave a surplus of \$19,000.

It is proposed to offer the rest of the stock to directors of the old institution and to investors and should the scheme prove successful the bank would have \$150,000 in addition to the \$19,000 surplus with which to start business. MacGibbon and Charles J. Kleiman, who is associated with MacGibbon in working out the plan, believe that it is feasible and will meet with success. If the reorganization scheme is successful before May 15 and the bank stands prepared to pay in full the dividend probably will not be paid. Judge Kavanaugh's object in advancing the date of distribution from April 25, was to give MacGibbon more time to work out his reorganization scheme.
