Before 9 o'clock Sixth street was solidly blocked and automobiles honked in vain for a pathway through the mass of humanity. Between 10 and 11 the theater crowds began to pour in and long before the count was complete in any precinct standing room wherever there was a chance to get a glimpse of the bulletin board was taken and those who wished to get from one place to another had to shoulder their way to the outskirts of the throng and go around the block.
