

WEST COAST SAFE, DECLARES CAPTAIN

PILOT MAKES LONG VOYAGE

Gunderson Said to Have Boarded Steamer Off Cape Mearns.

When Captain Archie Pease brought the British steamer Clan Maciver up to the river Thursday he received a high compliment from Captain Wright, her master, on the service being maintained at the mouth of the Columbia, which was flatteringly to Captain Pease as a member of the Port of Portland Commission.

SKIPPER SEES NO CAUSE FOR ALARM OF AMERICANS IN MEXICO.

In the opinion of Fred Jebson, who is operating the Norwegian steamer Jason from Portland and San Francisco to Mexico, there is little reason for the stir that has been made by Americans along the coast that has resulted in some of them making their way to the United States, and prompted the Government to order the United States Army transport Buford to leave San Francisco tomorrow night to patrol the west coast and pick up refugees.

JASEN CARRIES REFUGEES

Mr. Jebson reached Portland yesterday from the lower coast, having traveled as far as San Diego on the Jason and she also reached Portland yesterday, but her charter came from Southern California by rail.

MASTER OF VESSEL PLYING BETWEEN PORTLAND AND SOUTH NOT OPTIMISTIC OVER PROSPECTS FOR FUTURE CARGO.

"We carried a dozen women, two men and several children on the Jason from Manzanillo to San Diego, they being the so-called refugees," said Mr. Jason. "They came mostly from Guadalajara, and it seemed that they feared that in the event the rebels were victorious over the Government, troops would work south in that vicinity. I was in eight ports along the coast and not in one did I find any disturbance. The coast region is not the scene of the campaign and I think that most of the women we carried were simply nervous."
