

KELLAMER LEADS RACE FOR SENATE

County Clerk Fields Completes Count for Assemblers.

PERSONNEL NOT CHANGED

Results Same as Published Day After Election—Official Figures on Sheriff and Others Not Due Until Monday.

As surely as the Republican National convention meets in Chicago next June and the name of Theodore Roosevelt is placed in nomination for the Presidency, the ex-President may depend on the votes of the 16 delegates from this state as long as he has a chance for the nomination.

That the slightest question should be raised as to the probable attitude of the Republican delegates from this state at the National convention was suggested by a recent opinion of the Attorney-General.

Technicality Not Regarded. Disregarding altogether this ruling by the state's legal adviser, and evincing no disposition to take advantage of the slightest technicality, the delegates have taken the position that the initiative law in this state for the election by direct vote of the people of National political conventions is capable of no other interpretation than that they must support that candidate for the Presidency.

Will of People Rules. "Although I supported Senator La Follette for the Presidency in the recent election in this state," said Thomas McCusker, "I shall adhere to the expressed wish of the people and vote for Roosevelt in the convention. I feel it my duty to vote for the man who received the vote of the people of this state."

"Having been elected by the people," said Charles H. Carey, "I shall carry out the spirit and intent of the will of the people who elected me and I am willing to abide by it, regardless of my own views."

"I shall vote for Roosevelt from the beginning and as long as his name is before the convention," said Charles W. Ackerson, "I was elected with that understanding and I shall abide by it."

"I would only be a traitor to the people of Oregon," replied Mr. Boyd, "if I did not vote for Roosevelt as a candidate. The vote in Oregon has clearly shown the state is progressive. Personally I favor Hughes, but I will lend my support to any progressive candidate who can be nominated should it be shown clearly that Roosevelt cannot be named."

Any Progressive, Says Boyd. "I could not say until on the floor of the convention," replied Mr. Boyd, "when asked how long he would consider it his duty to support Roosevelt as a candidate. The vote in Oregon has clearly shown the state is progressive. Personally I favor Hughes, but I will lend my support to any progressive candidate who can be nominated should it be shown clearly that Roosevelt cannot be named."

THOUSANDS VIEW CLUB

MULTNOMAH FORMAL OPENING IS DECIDED SUCCESS.

Palatial Building Surprises Visitors. Rooms Decked With Flowers Add to Beauty.

Five thousand of Portland's society folk packed the magnificent 4250,000 Multnomah Amateur Athletic Club structure last night at the formal opening of the club, wandering here and there throughout the palatial edifice from 8 o'clock until close to 11 o'clock thoroughly scrutinizing every detail of the building whose construction presents the combined efforts of nearly 2700 members.

"We were really surprised at the remarkable turnout on the part of the people of the city," said A. H. Allen, chairman of the entertainment committee of the club. "Nearly 7000 invitations were sent out to the various clubs, churches, schools, and other organizations, and nearly one-half of the total going out to non-members."
