Dr. Boyd also criticized the Municipal League...

Referring to the cleaning up of the Chicago City Council, the speaker said: "There is an assumption that every good citizen wants a good man in office to be elected because the voters are ignorant as to the facts. In Chicago the Municipal Voters League published the facts concerning every candidate, the facts were printed, and each could be proved absolutely and which would stand in any suit for slander. You could pick up the sheet issues, and see the facts. These facts were written up and placed before the public when they were all to pieces."
