Company's Rights Outlined

Under the terms of the proposed grant the company may change from single to double tracks, but not from double to single without consent of the City Council.

Crossing Precautions Taken

A provision of the measure calls for the stopping of all trains on approaching East Morrison street.

Another important provision requires any other railway crossing the Hill lines within the district sought by the Hill lines to permit the Hill company to use the tracks in common with the other.

Applegate, Anale Bergman, Raphael Geisler, UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, May 18.—(Special.)—The appointment committee at the University, whose office it is to recommend teachers in response to requests which come in from soliciting school boards over the state, has already secured the election of four students about to graduate from the University of Oregon.

As stipulated in the law standardizing the University and in the educational laws passed by the last Legislature, a diploma from the University of Oregon is now equal to a high school teaching certificate without examination.

Last year among the 48 young men and women who graduated from the University 22 are now teaching in the schools of Oregon, several of them having been elected to superintendencies and principalships through the employment agency of Dr. Schaefer or some other member of the University appointment committee.
