Jersey Breeds 900. The highest price paid for a Jersey cow was \$490, bid in by E. E. Lyon, of Independence, Or. This cow, known as Lady's Pet of Kilburn, is 8 years old.

West Feels Satisfied. Mr. West expressed satisfaction over the result of the sale, although he had expected better prices for some of the stock. He believes that with the distribution of such high-bred cattle throughout the Northwest a great dairying business, as more thoroughbred stock is acquired by the farmers and dairymen, will be the result.

Careful Selections Made. "The herd sold today represents my ideal in Jersey stock," said Mr. West. "That I might surprise my past offerings I made a trip to the Jersey state and personally selected from the best herds. Bringing these cattle more than 1000 miles to Oregon, ten days afterwards I am winning 25 first prizes, 15 second prizes and nine champion prizes out of 12 and five grand champion prizes out of six.
