Floral Battle Will Be Waged Hotly Around Throne of Rex Oregonus.

The Portland Railway, Light & Power Company has granted the request of J. H. Nolte for flat cars for use in the shower of roses and battle of flowers, that is to be held Friday of the Rose Festival.
