NEW GENERATOR BOUGHT. Power Company Gets Machine From East of 10,000 Horsepower. Telegraphic advices were received yesterday that the largest steam driven turbo generator ever built for the Pacific Coast was ready for shipment to Portland and would be loaded on 19 cars at Schenectady, N. Y., July 3. The machine weighs 325,000 pounds, and will cost when installed \$80,000. It has been bought by the Portland Electric Light & Power Company, and will be erected in Station E at the foot of Twenty-first street. It has a capacity of 10,000 horsepower.

OREGON IS DUE SATURDAY. Famous Battleship Prepares to Visit Home State. Captain Jensen, commanding the battleship Oregon, telegraphed Captain Speier, harbormaster, yesterday that the famous old fighting vessel would be off the Columbia River entrance at 3 A. M. Saturday, bound on her initial cruise into the waters of her home state. Captain Archie Pease, who piloted the big cruiser Maryland from the lower harbor to Portland and return, has been selected to act as co-captain for the Oregon and will make the run over her from Tacoma, which port she leaves at daybreak Friday. Arrangements will be completed today for barges to be moored alongside the battleship here so that crews can be handled without trouble or danger, besides another float will be provided for the reception of ashes and other debris from the vessel.

Shingle Mill Is Busy. PORT ORFORD, Or., July 3.—(Special.)—The Port Orford shingle mill is turning out white cedar shingles at the rate of 30,000 daily, most of which are being shipped to San Francisco. The Randolph took a cargo of nearly 800,000 last week, and will return for another cargo next week.
