COUNCIL IS WARY

Members Favor Restricting Heuser Franchise.

CARLINE CANNOT BE SOLD

Street Committee Recommendations Will Prevent Present Company Taking Over Proposed Franchise.

Fearing that the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company may be behind George Heuser in his plan to extend a streetcar line from the Kenton district down to the Broadway bridge and thence up Seventh street to Grant street, members of the City Council are going to urge that before a franchise is granted to Mr. Heuser provision be made to prevent him from selling out. This was made apparent yesterday when the street committee of the Council considered the proposed franchise and recommended sending it to the Council with amendments to the effect that the line cannot be sold. This amendment was introduced by Councilman Maguire.

Councilman Maguire and others fear they say that the new line will be built and the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company will buy it out, thus securing rights on the Broadway bridge and up Seventh street to Grant street. This will take in territory which was sought by the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company up to two months ago, when negotiations

ERRING TO GET AID

Probationers Will Be Listed and Looked After.

COURT PLANS EXPERIMENT

Leniency to Heads of Families Is Often Abused Through Weakness or Sense of Security—Officer Will Be Detailed.

In search of more enlightened methods of dealing with that class of offenders who are not criminals, but usually heads of families, Chief of Police Slover and Municipal Judge Tazewell are arranging to install a probation officer to work in harmony with the court and look after the conduct of convicted persons who have enjoyed the leniency of the court. The intention is to select a police officer of discretion and maturity and one with a kindly disposition to devote all his time to the work.

Necessity for some such arrangement has been growing of late, and has been accentuated by developments in recent cases. That suspended sentences, granted at the time upon a convincing showing of the offender's purpose through neglect to follow them, has been demonstrated in many instances.

THIEF CHECK IS APPLIED

RECORD OF LOST AND SOLD ARTICLES TO BE KEPT.

Description of Stolen Articles Will Be Tallied Daily With Sales at Pawnshops.

CAPTAIN BATY GIVES ADVICE TO OWNERS OF VALUABLES.
 "If you have a watch, a gun, a bicycle, a camera, or any other article that is numbered, and you don't want to lose it, write down the number. Then, if it is taken, it cannot be sold here without our setting it back for you. We may help you anyhow, but if you have the number, our work will be more certain."

With the installation yesterday in detective headquarters of a big filing case, in which are to be filed records of lost articles, the last word in the recovery of stolen goods has been said, so far as Portland is concerned. From now on, given accurate description, the location of missing articles is made an exact science and recoveries are expected to increase notably.
